

Your Gifts Make a Difference

Last Tuesday, ten volunteers from St. Philip the Deacon worked at the Twin Cities Habitat for Humanity Panel Plant in Northeast Minneapolis. The panel plant is set up inside a large warehouse to build the framing panels for new homes. The plant has three platform tables, each large enough to hold one entire wall section in a kind of assembly line. After learning the names of various pieces (King stud, Jack stud, Cripple stud, Header, etc.), SPD volunteers utilized precut lumber and assembled exterior and interior wall sections—including framing in doors and windows. Each panel was then numbered and stacked accordingly. Panels from our build will be used this summer on one of five new Habitat for Humanity home construction sites. To everyone who helped with this meaningful and important project, thank you. Remember: Your gifts make a difference.

Did You Know

As announced earlier this week, Pastor Cheryl Mathison, our Teaching Pastor, will be retiring this spring. Her final Sunday in worship will be Sunday, May 12. During Pastor Mathison's 21-year call to St. Philip the Deacon, she has—among many other things—taught countless classes on the Bible and theology, regularly instructed our families and youth on the sacraments, and led five different travel groups to the Holy Land, Germany and Greece. For more than two decades at St. Philip the Deacon she has been a gifted teacher, worship leader and preacher, a trusted colleague, and a caring pastor. We give thanks for her good and faithful service. We invite you to put two dates on your calendar related to our celebration of Pastor Mathison's retirement: Thursday, May 2, from 5 to 7 p.m., when we will hold an open house reception in her honor at Wayzata Country Club; and the weekend of Saturday and Sunday, May 11 and 12, when we will thank her during our worship services, and when she will preach her final sermon at St. Philip the Deacon.
